THE new Kimberly West building saw the laying of the supporting steel reinforced concrete slab to support the new building on March 17.

Wessex Care Managing Director Matthew Airey said it was an exciting transition from the hole to the beginning of the state of the art care centre.

“The highlight for our residents will probably be larger bedrooms all with en suite and extended communal living space with Kitchen, and Health Spa facilities.”

“These will be further extended with a club room on the completion of phase two. Behind the scenes will be a range of high-tech monitoring, support and communication systems to help ensure we maintain our reputation for individualised care, enablement and independence in a safe and protected environment., “ he said.

He said they will also work hard to maintain the homeliness that Kimberly House Nursing Home is so well regarded for.

Frontrow Director Mark said they had currently completed the enabling and temporary works. “We have completed the bulk of the excavation and onsite drainage for the first phase of the project,” he said.

He said once the floor was done they will start to build the external concrete retaining walls to the perimeter of the site and brick work will follow in the next four weeks.

The home is expected to be completed by January next year.
